

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE GREATER LAFOURCHE PORT COMMISSION

APRIL 2, 1969

The Greater Lafourche Port Commission of the State of Louisiana met in regular session at its regular meeting place, the office of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission, in Galliano, Louisiana, on Wednesday April 2, 1969, at 10:00 A.M., pursuant to the provisions of due notice given in writing to each and every member thereof and duly posted in the manner required by law.

There were present: A. O. Rappelet, Felton Galliano, Earl Angelle, Daize Cheramie, Minor Cheramie, Dudley Bernard and James Summersgill III.

There were absent: Dr. J. A. Gravois and Jessie Guidry.

The Greater Lafourche Port Commission was duly convened by Hon. A. O. Rappelet, President, who announced the purpose of the meeting in accordance with the aforesaid written notice thereof, and then stated that the Commission was ready for the transaction of business.

The minutes of the meeting of March 25, 1969 were read. It was moved by James Summersgill III, seconded by Minor Cheramie that the minutes be accepted as read. There being no objections, the minutes were adopted as read.

The President discussed the need for amending the Greater Lafourche Port Commission Citizens Advisory Committee membership from 15 to approximately 25 in order to include a greater cross-section of citizen areas. It was suggested by the Commission members that the next meeting be held at the 10th Ward Annex building, on Thursday April 10, 1969 at 6:30 P.M., and that the persons who have been recommended by the President to serve on the Citizens Advisory Committee be invited to attend the meeting, in order to determine the amount of participation by said persons.

The President stated that he had received some applications for industrial or business sites in Port Fourchon. He requested that the news media inform the public that the Port Commission was at present accepting such applications.

John Cox, bonding attorney, discussed various aspects of bonding structures, in particular as it related to the Port Commission.

It was moved by Daize Cheramie, seconded by Minor Cheramie and duly passed that the meeting be adjourned.
