

OFFICIAL PRECEEDINGS OF THE GREATER LAFOURCHE PORT COMMISSION

NOVEMBER 13, 1972

The Greater Lafourche Port Commission of the State of Louisiana met in regular session at the Tenth Ward Annex Building in Galliano, Louisiana, on Monday, November 13, 1972, at 4:00 P.M., pursuant to the provisions of due notice given in writing to each and every member thereof and duly posted in the manner provided by law.

RESOLUTION




