RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a non-exclusive lease agreement has been drafted by and between the Greater Lafourche Port Commission and Dos Gris Seafood, Inc. for the use of the building, loading and unloading dock and parking area at the Port Commercial Marina, and

WHEREAS, said laese agreement has been submitted to the board in writing and has been read and approved by sections.

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed proposals for construction of "Restoration of Stone Jetties at Belle Pass" will be received by the Board of Commissioners, Greater Lafourche Port Commission, at their office in Galliano, Louisiana, until four-o-five (4:05) p.m., Central Standard Time, March 15, 1976, and immediately thereafter publicly opened and read.

Plans, Sepcifications, and Proposal Forms may be obtained at the office of Picciola & Associates, Inc., 4514 Louisiana Highway No. 1, P. O. Box 758, Galliano, Louisiana, 70354, up to within twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time for receiving proposals, for \$25.00 per set with no refund.

Each bid must be accompained by a satisfactory bid bond in the amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of the proposal.

No proposal will be considered unless it is accompanied by satisfactory evidence that the bidder holds a Louisiana State Contractor's License of proper classification and in full force and effect, in compliance with Act. Louisiana R.S. 37: 2151-63.

The succ-ssful bidder will be required to execute a performance and payment bond covering all labor and materials in the amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the contract amount.

No bid may be withdrawn for a period of thirty (30) days after the time for receiving bids.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive informalities.

It was moved by Adam Gisclair, Jr., seconded by Loyman Terrebonne, and unanimously adopted that for the purpose of allowing interested Contractors sufficient time to properly work out their bids for "Restoration of Stone Jetties at Belle Pass", theat the regular monthly meeting scheduled for March 8, 1976, be postponed one week to March 15, 1976.

Mr. Emmett Eymard, Board Member of the Department of Public Works addressed the Board regarding the availability of state funds for public projects. Mr. Eymard advised that funds were limited and that any request on our part should be made timely supported by the necessary preliminary work and research. Mr. Eymard also

assured the board of his assistance and support as a member of the Dept. of Public Works. He advised that our General Manager contact Mr. Roy Aguilliard, Director of Public Works to seek advise on proper procedure.
