# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE GREATER LAFOURCHE PORT COMMISSION

### MAY 10, 1971

The Greater Lafourche Port Commission of the State of Louisiana met in regular session at the Tenth Ward Annex Building in Galliano, Louisiana on Monday, May 10, 1971, at 4:10 P.M., pursuant to the provision of due notice given in writing to each and every member thereof and duly posted in the manner required by law.

There were present: Nolty Theriot, Antoine Estay, Andrew Martin, Tomey Doucet, Irvin Melancon, Jr., Harrison Cheramie, Adam Gisclair, Loyman Terrebonne and Anson Toups.

Andrew Martin read the minutes of the last meeting held on April 12, 1971, It was moved by Anson Toups, seconded by Adam Gisclair and duly passed that the minutes be adopted as read.

It was moved by Anson Toups, seconded by Loyman Terrebonne and duly passed that the financial report be accepted as read.

BY-LAWS COMMITTEE Andrew Martin, Chairman, reported on the status of our Act # 332 as it now stands.

It was moved by Andrew Martin, seconded by Harrison Cheramie, and unanimously adopted that the Greater Lafourche Port Commission hereby revoke and rescind a resolution adopted at our meeting of April 12, 1971, authorizing our bonding attorney to draft amendments to Act # 332 changing the priorities and giving the Commission credit for the interest earned from the investment of the bonds.

### RESOLUTION

RESOLVED: That acts be presented to the Legislature to amend Act No. 332 of the Regular Legislative Session of the State of Louisiana for the year 1970, in the following particulars, to-wit:

(1) To amend Section I of Act No. 332, allowing the Greater Lafourche Port Commission to work on any one or all of the projects listed as long as the State Treasurer has set aside the specific funds for each particular project and has filed with the Greater Lafourche Port Commission a certification that the required funds have been set aside for the specific project item or items described in said Act # 332 of 1970.

- (2) That the State Treasurer be authorized and directed to transfer any funds directly to the Greater Lafourche Port Commission without first transferring said funds to the Department of Public Works.
- (3) That the State Treasurer shall apply the amount of the accrued interest earned on the investment of the proceeds of the bond issued pursuant to said Act # 332 of 1970 to the amount required by said Act # 332, 1970, to be paid by the Greater Lafourche Port Commission for the interest on the bonds issued pursuant to Act # 332 of 1970.
- (4) All mortgage requirements called for in said Act # 332 of 1970 be and are hereby revoked and repealed.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE Antoine Estay, Chairman reported that a Port Commission Committee would be going to Baton Rouge to meet with our Legislative Delegation concerning our amendment to Act # 332.

Mr. Estay also read a letter from Mr. Walter C. Vogt with the Lafourche Parish Civil Defense requesting that we drive 2 - 5 pile clusters in front of the Lady of the Sea, General Hospital, to be used in case of emergencies during hurricanes. Nolty Theriot appointed a committee to work with the Civil Defense towards the construction of these facilities. Appointed to this committee were:

PUBLIC RELATION COMMITTEE Harrison Cheramie, Chairman reported on a meeting of the South Lafourche Lions Club attended by Irvin Melancon. The club was furnished with a map of the Fourchon area and there was a discussion on the present status of the port and our plans for the future. Mr. Cheramie also informed us that the Port Commission had been put on the mailing list of the Port of Pascagoula and the Port of New Orleans.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE Irvin Melancon, Jr., Chairman reported that Louisiana Land & Exploration Co. had forwarded to us the initial surface lease on lands they own jointly with the City of New Orleans. Negotiations are now in progress between the Port Commission and LL&E on this lease.

Mr. Melancon also reported on an inspection tour of the Port of Pascagoula made on April 21, 1971, by himself, Mr. L. G. LaPlante and Mr. Philip Caillouet.

NAVIGATIONAL AIDS Adam Gisclair, Chairman reported that we had several complaints that the Belle Passe Light # 4 is hard to distinguish because of all the other lights in the background. After consultation with Bill Linam of Automatic Power, and the U.S. Coast Guard it was decided to made the changes necessary to make this light more effective.

It was moved by Adam Gisclair, seconded by Irvin Melancon, and unanimously adopted that the Belle Passe Channel Light # 4 be changed from a white light to a red light, and that this light be made into a directional range light, that is, concentrate the full power of this light in one direction instead of having it shine in all directions.

COMMERCIAL MARINA & BOAT LAUNCH FACILITY Loyman Terrebonne, Chairman, reported that the field survey for the Boat Launch Facility was completed, and that this project would be handled in two phases. Mr. Terrebonne then introduced Mr. J. Wayne Plaisance and Mr. Marco Picciola, the engineers on this project, who made a presentation on this proposed facility to the audience.

On motion by Loyman Terrebonne, seconded by Adam Gisclair, and adopted by the following vote:

#### RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED: Sealed bids will be received by the Greater Lafourche Port Commission in the meeting room of the Tenth Ward Annex Building, Galliano, Louisiana, until 4:30 P.M. June 14, 1971, for Phase "A" - Dredging for Boat Launch Facilities - Port Fourchon - Approximately 44,500 Cu. Yds. Sealed proposals shall be marked "Phase A - Dredging"

The character of the bid shall be per liner foot. The contracter agrees to furnish the Greater Lafourche Port Commission with a 5% bid bond. Bidders shall state the number of consecutive working days to complete the project including the day the work order is issued. Payments shall be made in thirty day installments according to estimates of work completed made by the engineers.

The contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidders with the Greater Lafourche Port Commission reserving the right to reject any and all bids.

J. Wayne Plaisance, Inc. and Picciola & Associates, Inc. will be the authorized representatives of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission and the construction and progress of the project will be subject to their inspections.

RECORDS & FIXED ASSETS Anson Toups, Chairman, reported on the successful bidders on the purchase of an automobile and the sale of various Port equipment.
