OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE GREATER LAFOURCHE PORT COMMISSION

NOVEMBER 8, 1976

The Greater Lafourche Port Commission of the State of Louisiana met in regular session in the Conference Room of the Commission Administration Building in Galliano, Louisiana, on Monday, November 8, 1976, at 4:00 P.M., pursuant to the provision of due notice given to each and every member thereof and duly posted in the manner provided by law.

There were present: Adam Gisclair, Jr., Tomey Doucet, Harrison Cheramie, Jr., Irvin Melancon, Jr., Loyman Terrebonne, Paris Theriot, II, and Anson Toups.

There were absent: Andrew Martin and Jimmy Guidry.

In the absence of the President, the Vice-President, Adam Gisclair, Jr., duly convened the meeting and announced the purpose of the meeting in accordance with the aforesaid written notice.

The Secretary Harrison Cheramie, Jr., read the minutes of the last meeting held on October 11, 1976. It was moved by Harrison Cheramice, Jr., seconded by Loyman Terrebonne and duly passed that the minutes be adopted as read.

The Treasurer, Tomey Doucet, then read the financial statement for the month of October, 1976, as follows:

It was moved by Tomey Doucet, seconded by Anson Toups, and unanimously adoted that the financial statement be accepted as read.

The Vice-President then announced that bids would now be opened for a proposed property lease at Port Fouchon, called "Petroleum Industry Site Number 1", and asked if there were any bids to be submitted from the audience.

Only one bid was submitted from LOOP Inc., in the amount of \$2,300.00 per month, or \$2.00 per frontage foot along Bayou Lafourche.

On motion by Paris Theriot, II, second by Adam Gisclair, Jr., the following resolution was adopted by the following vote:

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Greater Lafourche Port Commission does hereby accept the bid submitted by LOOP Inc. for the leasing of "Petroleum Industry Site Number 1". Said bid being in the amount of \$2,300.00 per month, or \$2.00 per front footage along Bayou Lafourche.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the President, Andrew Martin, is authorized and empowered by and on behalf of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission to execute the lease doucment with LOOP Inc.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Ramco International, Inc., successful bidder for construction of "Navigational Aid Timber Support Structure", did not timely complete the job, thereby putting Ramco in default of the contract agreement, and

WHEREAS, according to contract terms, the Port Commission has the right to collect in liquidated damages the sum of \$200.00 per calendar day for each day Contractor is in default of completion, and

WHEREAS, according to Engineering Report dated October 20, 1976, Contractor took 47 days to complete project, which is 26 days over the alloted time (21 days), thereby owing the Port Commission \$5,200.00 in liquidated damages on a job bidded at \$4,766.00, and

WHEREAS, Ramco provided all of the material necessary for the structure, but sub-contracted the actual construction to another contractor for the price of \$3,280.00, and

WHEREAS, although the Board Members feel that Ramco should be penalized for breach of contract, they do not wish to cause any financial loss to the sub contractor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Greater Lafourche Port Commission does hereby authorize the General Manager, Irvin Melancon, Jr., to contact Ramco International, Inc. representative and inform them of the Port decision to withhold liquidated damages in the amount of \$1,486.00 (estimated cost of material), and to pay Ramco \$3,280.00, the price charged by sub-contractor for actual construction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the General Manager is directed to release payment to Ramco only with assurance that the \$3,280.00 will be given to sub-contractor as payment in full for the construction of "Navigational Aid Timber Support Structure" at Belle Pass.

On motion by Paris Theriot, II, second by Tomey Doucet, the following resolution was adopted by the following vote:
