RESOLVED: That the request form LOOP, Inc. to construct and maintain a 30" brine and a 48" crude oil pipeline and pertinent facilities located in Lafourche Parish and in the Gulf of Mexico off the coast of Louisiana is approved and Recording Secretary was directed to issue the necessary "Letter of No Objection" to LOOP, Inc., with copy sent to the U.S. Corps of Engineers.

Executive Assistant gave a progress report on the following topics:

- 1. Port's efforts to lease acerage at Port Fourchon from the various Land Owners.
- 2. The sub-leasing of the Port Fourthon Boat Launch Facility.
- 3. Navigational Aids from Loutheast Louisiana Canal to the Grand Isle area.
- 4. Status of C.E.I.P. application and Public Hearing.
- 5. Copy of letter from U.S. Corps of Engineers to Lafourche Parish Police Jury concerning Lafourche Jump Waterway Project.

It was moved by Harrison Cheramie, Jr., seconded by Roland Guidry, and duly passed that the "Construction Estimate No. 5" as submitted by Picciola & Associates, Inc. be accepted by the Board of Commissioners and that payment in the amount of \$83,494.72 be made to the contractor Boh Brothers Construction Company, Inc. as full payment, less 10% retainage, for work completed on "Relocation of Fourchon Raod" as of May 5, 1978. The Baord further instructed the Recording Secretary to file necessary claim with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development for reimbursement of payments in accordance with Public Works letter of acceptance and authorization dated May 6, 1977.

Some Board members reported on various complaints concerning teh abandoned structures in Bayou Lafourche south of the Leeville Bridge. It was decided to check into the problem for possible solutions.

Mr. Bob Ward with Dowell, a Division of Dow Chemical, made a request to dock a barge to be used for heavy industrial water, next to their presently leased premises at Port Fourchon. Since said barge would extend beyond their leased boundarie—, the Board informed Mr. Ward that a lease for the additional property involved would have to be negotiated. The Commissioners directed the Executive Assistant to work with Mr. Ward and Dowell towards negotiating such a lease.

The Executive Assistant was also directed by the Board to send a letter to Lafourche Parish Sheriff Duffy Breaux inviting him to the next Commission meeting to discuss policing matters of interest to both our Agency and his Department.

Mr. John Rabb, with the Bayou Civic Club and Coach LeBlanc made a presentation to the Members on their proposed Larose Civic Center.
