OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE GREATER LAFOURCHE PORT COMMISSION

JANUARY 14, 1986

The Greater Lafourche Port Commission of the State of Louisiana met in regular session in the Conference Room of the Commission Administration Building in Galliano, Louisiana, on Tuesday, January 14, 1986, at 10:30 AM pursuant to the provision of due notice given in writing to each and every member thereof and duly posted in the manner provided by law.

PRESENT: Harrison J. Cheramie, Jr., W. J. Anselmi, Tomey J. Doucet, Robert M. Champagne, Murphy J. Cheramie, Dudley Bernard,

Anthony Toups and Roland J. Guidry

ABSENT: Louis Chabert

President Doucet convened the meeting and announced the purpose thereof in accordance with the aforesaid written notice.

On motion by Harrison J. Cheramie, Jr., seconded by Anthony Toups, and unanimously passed, the minutes of the regular meeting of December 10, 1984 were approved.

On motion by Dudley Bernard, seconded by Murphy J. Cheramie and unaimously passed, the minutes of the special meeting of December 23, 1985 were approved.

On motion by Murphy J. Cheramie, seconded by W. J. Anselmi and unanimously passed, the Board approved the Financial Statement for December, 1985.

On motion by Murphy J. Cheramie, seconded by Dudley Bernard and unaimously passed, the payment of all invoices received during the previous month was approved.

Approval of issuance of letters of no objection of the following applicants was given on motion by Roland J. Guidry, seconded by Anthony Toups, and the unanimous consent of the Board:

Commencing his report, President Doucet called for a motion to advertise for bids for a year's supply of clamshells, reefshells and/or limestone. Upon motion by Roland J. Guidry, seconded by Anthony Toups and unanimously passed, the Board of Commissioners does hereby authorize Director Falgout to advertise for and accept bids for supplying clamshells, reefshells or other suitable approved material for a period of one year (approximately 2,000 yards) to be tailgate spread in the Port Area as directed by the Commission.

In connection with Belle Pass Dry Docks, President Doucet stated that he, Director Falgout, Vice President Guidry and Secretary Cheramie went to New Orleans to sign the necessary documents to effectuate the bond sale. President Doucet then called upon Don Harang, who gave the Board an up to date report thereon.

President Doucet then read a letter from Mr. Dickie Guidry, President of Guidry Bros. Towing Company, who complemented the Board on the improvements made at Port Fourchon, particularly the new marine and public boat dock.

Commencing his report, Director Falgout reported that in connection with the Beach Stabilization Project, approximately 200' of bags have been installed on the beach. Director Falgout further stated that some type of mat should be placed in front of the bags to stop the erosion of the waves during a storm. However, Chevron (who is participating in the project) feels that mats should be placed under the bags. There have been further delays in connection with the delivery of the bags. However, Engineer Plaisance stated that the Contractor had sent a truck to Washington to pick up a shipment of approximately 100 bags. Dredging will start as soon as the bag project is complete.

In connection with the Capital Outlay Funds, Director Falgout reported that Dowell representatives are meeting today in connection with the proposed relocation of their facility. Engineer Plaisance stated that his firm had submitted proposed plans to Dowell and they in turn will submit proposed plans of their needs.

Director Falgout informed the Board that after many years of negotiation through our congressional delegation in Washington, the Corps of Engineers will meet here tomorrow to begin the reconnaisance study to go into the justification of assuming maintenance of Belle Pass. They estimate the study will take approximately six months. Once that is proven to be justifiable, they will go to the next phase, which will take about a year. Then, if that proves that the cost benefit ratio would be beneficial to the government to assume maintenance, it would go to the Corps budget. If things go according to plan, within four years the Corps should assume maintenance.

Director Falgout presented to the Board an ordinance in connection with the adoption of ad valorem taxes in the amount of 4.26 mills for bond redemption and 2.13 mills for maintenance and operation of the Port. Upon motion by Dudley Bernard, seconded by W. J. Anselmi, and adopted by the following vote:
