The following amendment to Ordinance No. 51 was presented by Jimmy Lafont, who moved its adoption, and was seconded by Wilbert Collins, Sr.:

ORDINANCE NO. 51 (Amended)

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A NO WAKE ZONE IN THE NAVIGABLE WATERWAYS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE GREATER LAFOURCHE PORT COMMISSION; ESTABLISHING ADMINISTRATION AND VIOLATION THEREOF; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission:

Section 1. That the Board of Commissioners of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission does hereby establish a NO WAKE ZONE in Bayou Lafourche, Flotation Canal, Pass Fourchon, and Belle Pass as follows:

- A. In Bayou Lafourche, the zone will cover from the floodgate in Larose, Louisiana and extend to the southernmost end of the Belle Pass Rock Jetty System.
- B. In Leeville, Louisiana, the zone will cover the first 1,000 feet of the East and West approaches to Bayou Lafourche in Southwestern Louisiana Canal;
- C. At Port Fourchon, the zone will cover all of Pass Fourchon and the Flotation Canal.

Section 2. This ordinance can be adjusted upon majority vote of the Commission to include or exclude any and all navigable waters of the Tenth Ward of the Parish of Lafourche as the boundaries and limits of said ward as presently fixed by law.

Section 3. Any person violating any provision of this amended ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or imprisoned for not more than six (6) months in jail, or both, in the discretion of the court having jurisdiction.

This amendment to Ordinance No. 51, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted at a public meeting of the Commission, was then submitted to an official vote as a whole; the vote thereon being as follows:
