The following ordinance was presented by <u>Harrison Cheramie, Jr</u>, who moved for its adoption, and was seconded by <u>Rodney J. Terrebonne</u>:

## ORDINANCE NO. 58

PROHIBITING THE CONSUMPTION ORDINANCE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON COMMERCIAL PORT PROPERTY AND FACILITIES IN PORT FOURCHON; **PROHIBITING** THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS; PROHIBITING THE USE OR POSSESSION OF ILLEGAL DRUGS OR LOOK-ALIKES PARAPHERNALIA; AND DRUG **ESTABLISHING** AND INSPECTION OF SUBJECTS, THEIR VEHICLES AND PERSONAL PROPERTY BEFORE ENTERING AND PROPERTY; ON PORT ESTABLISHING ADMINISTRATION AND CONTROL THEREOF; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{BE}}$  IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> That the Board of Commissioners of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission does hereby prohibit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on commercial port property and facilities in Port Fourchon.

SECTION 2. That the Board of Commissioners of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission does hereby prohibit the discharge of firearms on commercial port property and facilities in Port Fourchon.

SECTION 3. That the Board of Commissioners of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission does hereby prohibit the use or possession of illegal drugs or look-alikes and drug paraphernalia on commercial port property and facilities in Port Fourchon.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> All persons, their vehicles and personal property shall be subject to search and inspection before entering and while on commercial port property and facilities in Port Fourchon.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Any person found to be using or in possession of any of the aforementioned illegal or unauthorized items will be immediately removed from port property.

SECTION 6. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned for not more than six (6) months, or both, at the discretion of the court having jurisdiction.

This ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of said Commission, was then submitted to an official vote as a whole; the vote thereon being as follows:
